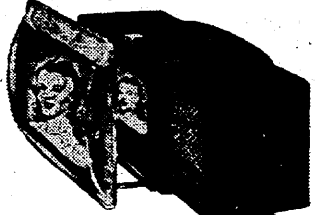

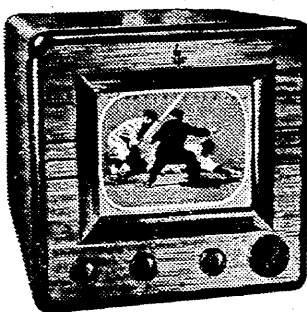
Answer: Very appreciative thanks for the presents they sent you is all that is necessary or expected. Announcements merely would emphasize that no invitations had been intended.

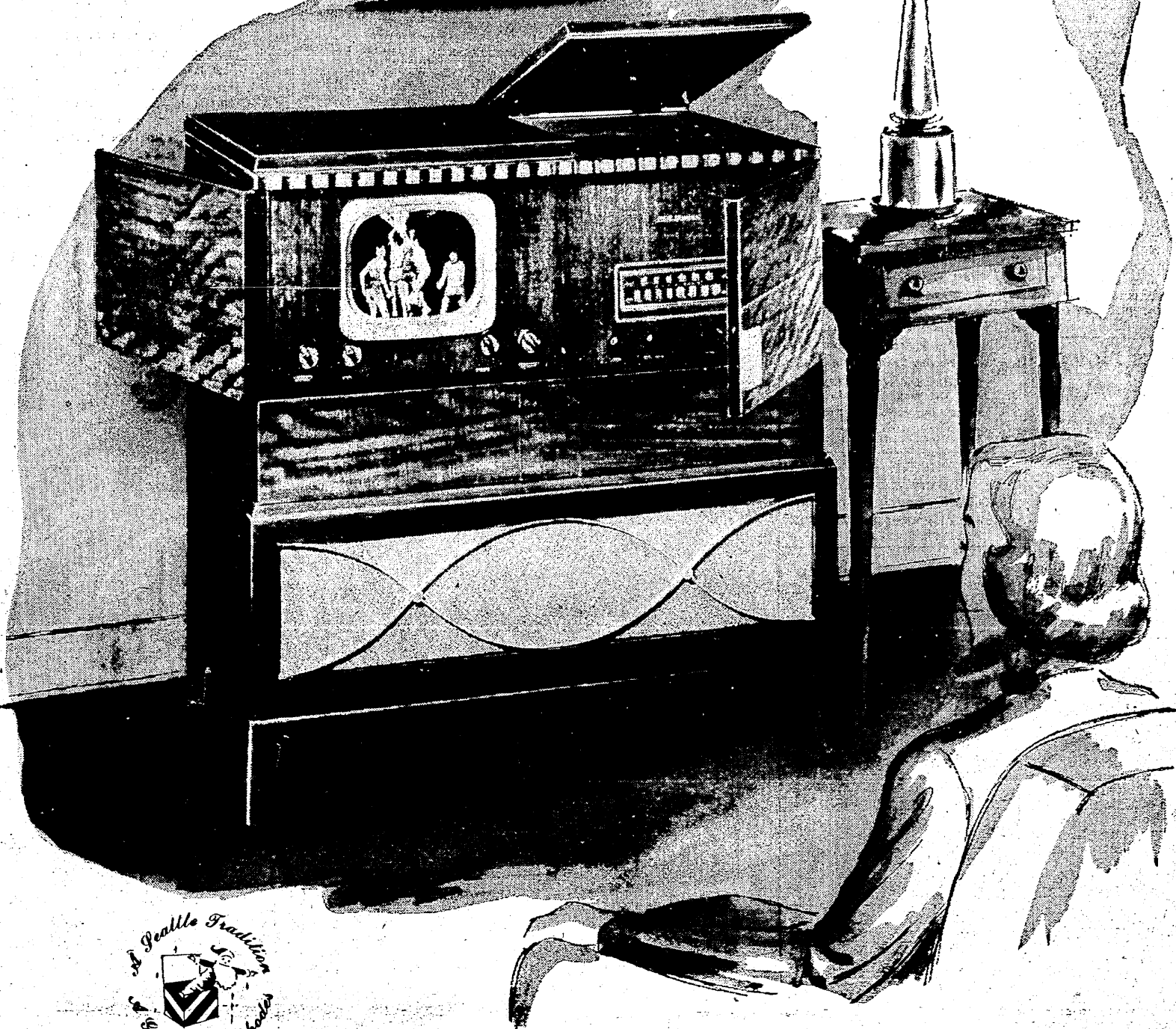

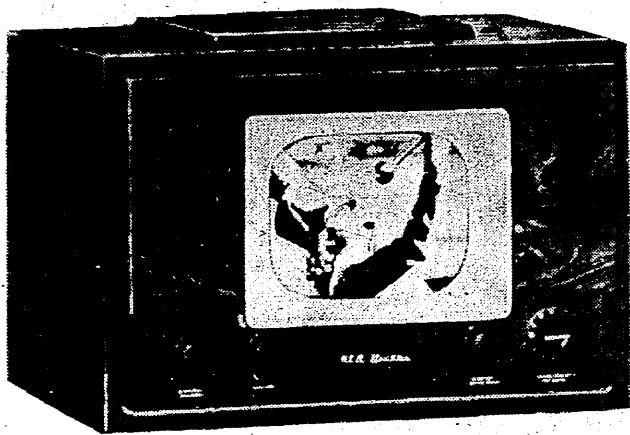

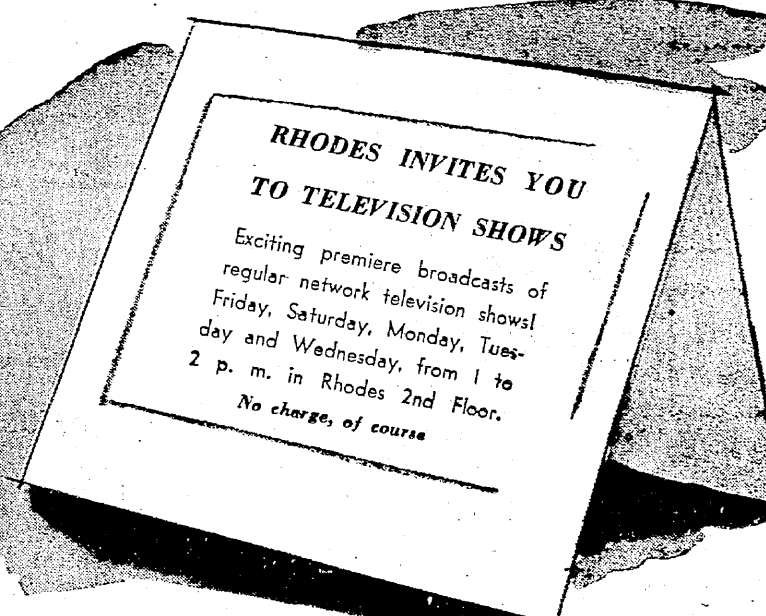
