

Varied Models Available In Television Sets

By model, television is offered in the following packages for home use:

Table models—television only, television plus FM, or television, AM, FM. Every size tube from 5-inch to 16-inch.

Consolelets—actually a table model with legs and a full skirt. No electrical change other than a larger speaker in some manufacturers' models.

Entertainment centers—television, radio and phonographs in one unit.

Matching units—these contain television only and are either consolelets or table models made to be placed alongside, or on top of radio-phonograph combinations of the same make.

The Federal Communications Commission has assured both manufacturers and purchasers that future changes such as color televisions, will not obsolete today's receivers. Color, for example, will be received on present receivers as black and white.

Actually, choice of a specific set should be based on the purchaser's requirements, his ability to pay and the reputation of the manufacturer.

Girls Bless Navy For Helping Make Christmas Merry

WILMINGTON, Del., Nov. 24.—(AP)—"God bless Mama and Daddy—and bless the Navy Department, too."

That prayer was offered up last night by Sandra Oldham, 8 years old, and her sister, Barbara, 6, after they learned they would be able to spend Christmas with their mother—an infantile-paralysis victim—and their stepfather, a sailor stationed in California.

After Mrs. Evelyn Oldham was stricken in San Diego, Calif., the girls were flown to Wilmington to live with their stepfather's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Matthew Oldham.

The flight from the West Coast was arranged by the Navy.

Yesterday they learned the stepfather is being transferred to the Philadelphia Naval Base. His wife is being moved to the Naval Hospital in that city.

When Sandra and Barbara were told they will have a family Christmas after all, they said their usual prayer for "Mama and Daddy"—and included the Navy Department as well.

Dependents' Travel To Japan Curbed

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24.—(AP)—The Army said yesterday that no more dependents of persons stationed in Japan can go there because Americans being evacuated from China to Japan are occupying all available housing facilities.

Most of the Americans being taken to Japan from China will be brought to the United States by Army transports, the Army indicated.

The suspension of dependent civilian travel to Japan is expected to continue during December and January, the Army indicated.

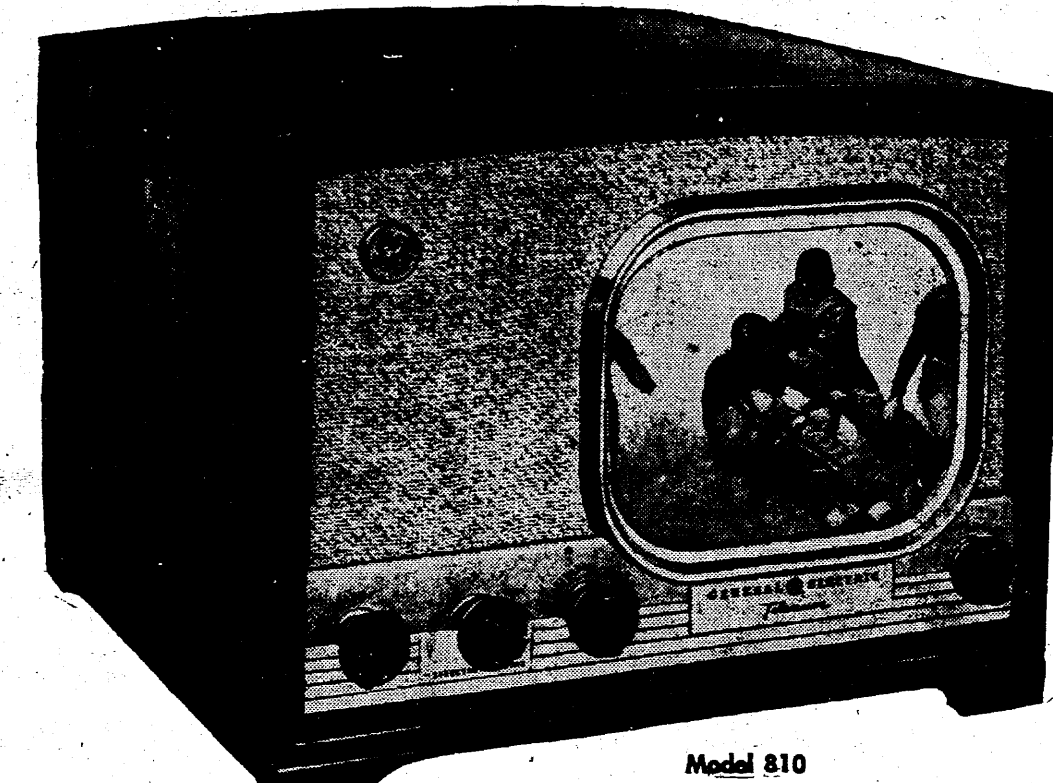
The coroner's office ruled last night she died of a beating, shock and exposure.

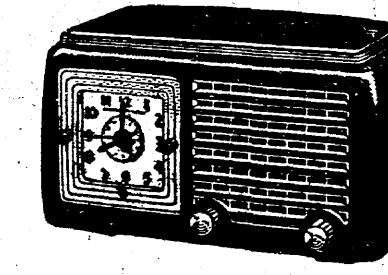
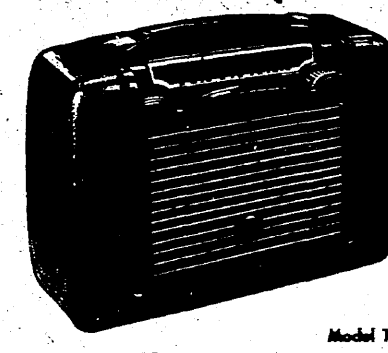
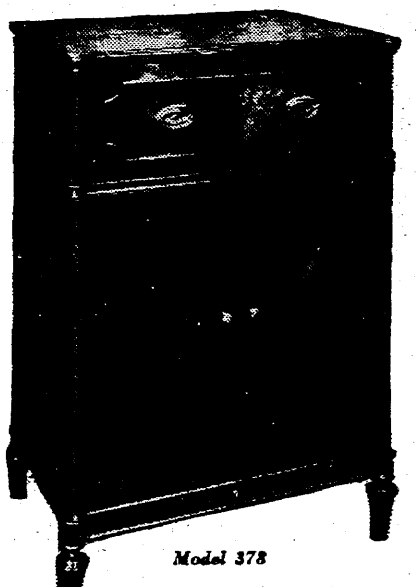
