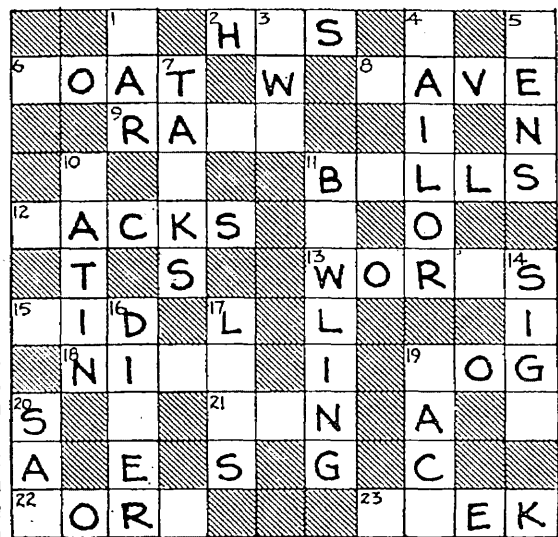


It's Higher! Prize Crossword Puzzle 367 Worth \$700

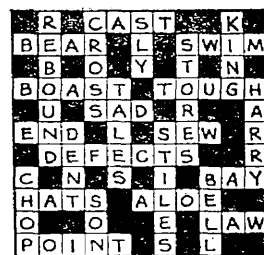

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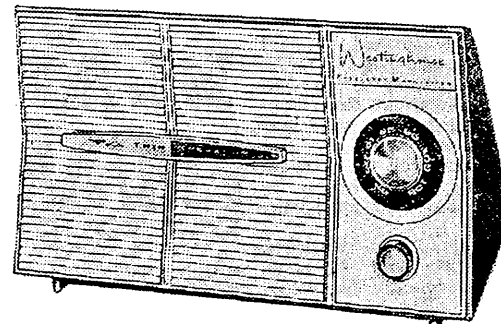
