Live from Germany . . . Election returns . . . 1 p. m. to 3 p. m. today . . . End of bulletin.

How many radio listeners are deeply involved in the personalities of European politics is a moot point. The significance is that those who are let their appreciation be known.

"Last time we offered this, we got a tremendous response," Ken Kager, KUOW manager, said. "There must be a lot of world-affairs experts around. Or Germanophiles."

Four years ago, German election returns were the basis for the first coast-to-coast National Educational Radio link, Kager said.

"The Germans vote on Sunday," Kager commented. ". . . A darned reasonable idea."

The commentators are expected to do a good job in bringing American listeners up to date. Fairly obviously, there will be no equivalent coverage on commercial radio stations.

## CHILDREN'S SHOW IS BACK

A delightful children's program, if memory serves well, will return to the air at 4 p. m. Saturday. No School Today, featuring Big Jon and Sparky, will be reactivated through National Educational Radio and KUOW.

The children's adventure, which did for the theme "Teddy Bear's Picnic" what the Lone Ranger did to "William Tell," was a Cincinnati-based radio show. It went off the network (again if memory serves) in 1948. Jon Arthur will present the new program from San Francisco.
